**Topic: Customs and traditions**

**Custom :1 a**: a usage or practice common to many or to a particular place or class or habitual with an individual  $\mathbf{b}$ : long-established practice considered as unwritten law  $\mathbf{c}$ : repeated practice  $\mathbf{d}$ : the whole body of usages, practices, or conventions that regulate social life.

**Tradition:** 1 **a**: an inherited, established, or customary pattern of thought, action, or behavior (as a religious practice or a social custom)  $\mathbf{b}$ : a belief or story or a body of beliefs or stories relating to the past that are commonly accepted as historical though not verifiable  $\mathbf{2}$ : the handing down of information, beliefs, and customs by word of mouth or by example from one generation to another without written instruction  $\mathbf{3}$ : cultural continuity in social attitudes, customs, and institutions.

- 7. What customs do you practice? What are your favorite customs? What customs do you think should be revised? What customs do you think should no longer be practice? What customs (from elsewhere) do you think should be included in our culture?
